President: Jeff Evans – As an EMC and power systems engineer for an electronics company in Roseville, I graduated from the University of Oregon with a degree in Physics. I have served as secretary through chair for the Santa Clara Valley EMC Society and on several international and local technical conference committees. As the current MVP chair, I am concerned about improving regional air and water quality. I will continue to fight for burning alternatives, fewer diesel trucks and no asphalt or incinerator factories near our residences in the community.

Vice President: Daniel Foreman, MD – An ophthalmologist practicing in Auburn, I am Chair of the MVP Medical Committee. I received a B.A. in Biochemistry from UC Santa Barbara and entered the PhD program in Bio-Physics at U.C. Berkeley. I earned my M.D. at Baylor College of Medicine. As a Flight Surgeon in the Navy, I had extensive experience in environmental medicine, ER Medicine and family practice.

Secretary: Laurie Sweeney – A CPA and Consultant with 30 years of business experience in public accounting, controllerships and consulting. I have been a Meadow Vista resident since 1979. I am a past President of the Meadow Vista Trails Association and Past Chairman of the Board of the Placer County SPCA. My primary interest is preserving Meadow Vista's rural qualities as well as protecting our clean air and water.

Treasurer: Jim Schreiber – My wife and I have lived on Combie Rd. for 26 years. We raised 3 children in Meadow Vista and have enjoyed the qualities that make this community a great place to live. I have been very active in youth soccer and recreation, serving as President of the Soccer League for 7 years. I recently retired after operating a small business in Auburn for 23 years, and I believe my business background helps me fulfill the responsibilities of the office of Treasurer, which I've held since 2005.

Director: Chuck Bradford – A retired mechanical engineer who has lived in Meadow Vista since 2003, I graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy. After serving in nuclear submarines, I spent 33 years working on nuclear power and telecommunications projects for a large engineering/construction firm. Much of my engineering experience involved compliance with government regulations and environmental issues.
